

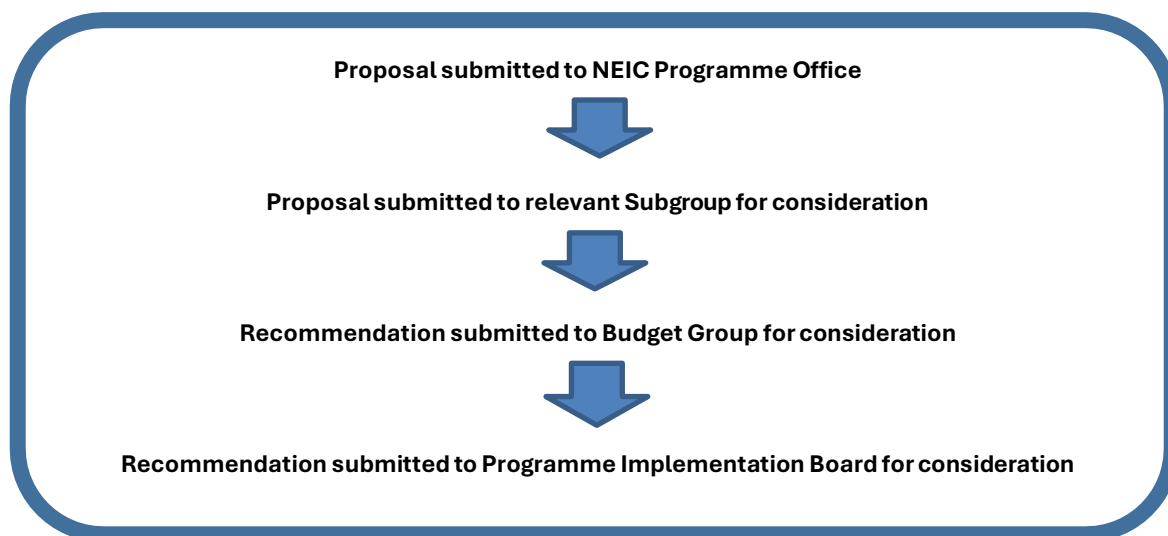
## Overview of Funding Process

The [Dublin North East Inner City \(NEIC\) Programme Implementation Board](#) was established in July 2017. The current Independent Chairperson, Mr. Jim Gavin, was appointed to the position by Government in May 2023. The Board is working hard to support the vibrant community of Dublin's North East Inner City. The main activities of the Board are guided by actions set out in the new NEIC [Strategic Plan 2024-2027](#) and the [Mulvey Report – Dublin North East Inner City – Creating a Brighter Future](#).

The Programme Implementation Board is supported by five Subgroups reflecting the priority workstreams identified in the NEIC Strategic Plan 2024 – 2027:

1. Enhancing Policing;
2. Maximising Educational, Training and Employment Opportunities;
3. Supporting Children, Young People, and Family Wellbeing;
4. Enhancing Community Wellbeing and the Physical Environment;
5. Improving Community Health, Wellbeing and Recovery

The following process is in place by the NEIC Programme Implementation Board for decisions on funding proposals received:



The process outlined above is not prolonged and a decision on funding proposals can be made within 6 to 8 weeks.

The NEIC Programme Implementation Board welcomes proposals from community-based groups which are aimed at implementing recommendations set out in NEIC Strategic Plan 2024-2027 / Mulvey Report in new, innovative and collaborative ways.
