12.15pm **Aisling Ennis** – harp, **Anna Cashell** violin,

Aisling Ennis and Anna Cashell present a programme of light classical music featuring Saint Saëns, Tedeschi and other popular classical works.

1.15pm **Éamonn Galldubh Trio**

Uilleann piper Éamonn Galldubh brings his fascinating exploration of pipes in the baroque era, performing music of Bach, Leclair, Handel as well as some traditional tunes accompanied by Rachel Factor (harpsichord) and Lioba Petrie (cello).

She was chosen for the Poetry Ireland Introductions Series in 2020 and the Words Ireland National Mentoring Programme in 2021.


