Summary of the Maritime Training Course

The experience gained from the introductory Marine Training Programme will give trainees the foundations to seek employment in the marine industry and prepare them to advance into further Marine education

For example, the Maritime College in Co. Cork or the Seamanship Centre in Co. Donegal

Students do not require any educational qualifications or previous marine experience prior to joining this course but Safe Pass & Manual Handling is required prior to starting

Module 1: Introduction to Dublin Port



Description: The purpose of this module is to provide awareness training in health and safety, as outlined in the code of practice for health and safety in dock work published by the health and safety authority (HSE) for any person engaged in work activity in ports and docks facility's

Module 2: Medical First Aid-STCW Code A-V1/4-1 (2 days)



Description: This is a standard for seafarers designated to provide medical first aid on board a ship

Module 3: Introduction to Powerboating (1 day)



Description: The aim of this powerboat course is to provide a short practical introduction to boat handling and safety on powerboats being used on all Irish waters, there is no requirement for previous experience

Module 4: Short Range Certificate for VHF Operators (SRC) (2 days)



Description: This course is the minimum qualification required for use of Very High Frequencies radios (VHF) on boats in coastal or inland waterways

Module 5: Coastal Navigation for Small Boats (2 days)



Description: The aim of the Irish Sailing (IS) navigation course is to provide participants with the skills and knowledge required to safely navigate a boat by day and night in coastal water with which they are familiar.

Module 6: Advanced Powerboat Certificate (3 days)



Description: The aim of the Advanced Powerboat Certificate is to develop boat handling seamanship, pilotage and navigation skills up to the standards required to drive a powerboat safely by day in coastal waters with which one is familiar.

Module 7: Introduction to Marine Engine Maintenance (2 days)



Description: The coxswain should know about the workings of an inboard and outboard engines

Module 8: Vessel Hull Maintenance for Large and Small Boats (6 days)



Description: The purpose of this course is to provide training in boat hull maintenance work including insurance surveys on underside of the hull on small and large vessels

Module 9: Sea-Man Ship Training Centre (Killybeggs) (3 days)



Description: The theoretical awareness and practical experience is given in preparation for sea survival in the event of abandonment

Module 10: Skippers Introduction to Boat Handling and Safety for large work boats (14 days)



Description: The experience and time gained within this module will help to build up the required sea-time needed to qualify for an (IS) commercial endorsement skippers' license.

Module 11: Working in Confined Space and Fire Safety (1 day)



Description: This course includes the main characteristics of a confined space

Module 12: Work Experience (5 days)



Description: This is the final phase of our training programme, and it will include work experience and sea-time as a qualified skipper and crew on a number of boats
